## Core English

Offers a comprehensive communicative approach to learning English, covering the four essential language skills - speaking, listening, reading and writing.

The mornings (periods 1 to 4) focus on developing core English skills. The afternoons (periods 5 to 7) offer the choice of General, Specialized or Academic Electives that allow you to tailor your program to your special needs.

## Focus on Communication (FOC)

Develop confidence, increase word power and improve pronunciation. This course is designed to help you communicate effectively and with ease in a wide range of situations from social settings to debates and presentations.

Morning oral communication classes (periods 2, 3 and 4 plus English in Action, period 1, on Fridays only) are combined with select afternoon Electives designed especially for FOC students. Course includes Chat Buddy - 5 hours per month - see page 5 for details.

## Exam Power Preparation (EPP)

Power Preparation for TOEFL, IELTS and TOEIC are highly structured, comprehensive courses of study with a proven record of success. Participants will be challenged to work hard, learn efficiently and study strategically to ensure exam success.

Mornings concentrate on developing common reading, critical writing and note taking skills. Afternoons (EPP Focus - see program guide table) focus on speaking, listening and writing skills for exam questions and real time test drills.

## Academic Pathway Program (APP)

The APP is an intensive academic English program developed specifically for preparing students to enter a college or university. See page 6 for details.

## TESOL - Teaching English

Earn a recognized (TESL Canada accredited) teaching certificate giving you the essential tools for teaching English, either in Canada or worldwide .

For certification by Quest, Quest level 9 English (see equivalency table) is the minimum entry requirement. For TESL Canada teacher certification, proven native speaking ability or a TOEFL score of 101 or an IELTS 7 and a B.A. degree are required.


Working Holiday Program: Combine any program (minimum 28 lessons) with a paid job placement in an area that reflects your skills and experience. Fees include preparation for job search (resume writing and interview skills) and job placement.

- Only International Experience Canada Working Holiday Visa holders are eligible.
- Minimum 4 weeks of intensive English is required prior to placement.

Study and Work: offered in partnership with select private career colleges (PCC). After improving your English skills, you move on to a PCC where you can work part-time while studying and full-time (up to 26 weeks) upon completion of your studies.

## Academic Pathway 3

The Academic Pathway Program (APP) is your gateway to higher education.

- Conditional admission to a college or university degree program on APP enrollment
- Develop English skills to a new level of excellence in preparation for academic success.
- Earn a recognized college or university degree.
- Begin working part-time upon entry to college or university.
- Work full-time for up to 3 years in Canada after graduating in your field of study.


## APP Overview

The APP is an intensive academic English program developed specifically for preparing students to enter a college or university.

- Entry: High-intermediate English - Quest level 7. Entry test required.
- Duration: 12 weeks and up to 16 weeks for students needing more practice.
- Exit: Successful completion of the Academic Pathway Exit Test. Students failing the exit test may retake it onetime two weeks later. Failing the second test will require an additional 4 weeks of study prior to taking the test again.

The course focusses on improving reading and writing skills, and developing research and analytical skills to rigourous academic standards. The program enables students to:

- Develop effective learning strategies and research skills for academic writing.
- Build an academic lexicon and develop strong presentation skills.
- Read effectively for main idea identification and scanning for specifics, and linking and.

Upon successful program completion students may enter into a wide variety of programs at partner institutions. Refer to the Quest Equivalency Table (Table B) on page 7 for the minimum language proficiency level required for entry into a college or university degree program.


## Scholarships - up to $\$ 3000$

Students who enroll and complete their first month at a university or college partner may be eligible for a Quest APP Scholarship of up to $\$ 1000$ ( $\$ 500$ standard plus an additional \$500 for students who score at least $90 \%$ on their APP exit test). Some colleges also offer scholarships (conditions) of up to \$2000.

## Structure and Levels

The Core English and Focus on Communication programs offer 11 levels of English from the beginner to high-advanced with flexible durations from 1 to 50 weeks. The EPP, APP and ELT programs have higher entry requirements with set durations of study.

In all programs (except TESOL, which has a standalone curriculum), the morning periods (1 to 4 - Monday to Friday) focus on developing core common skills while the afternoon periods (5 to 7 - Monday to Thursday) allow Core and FOC students to tailor their program to meet their needs through Electives or EPP Focus and APP and EPP students to focus on their specific academic objectives.

Accommodation is carefully screened and selected on the basis of your needs. Prior to your arrival, you will receive complete details, as in this sample profile:


Homestay: Homestay offers you the security of a home base and introduces you to the Canadian experience so that you get the most out of your experience. Distance: ~50 minutes by transit. Homestays are carefully selected and include:

- A fully furnished private room $\quad$ Laundry and other amenities
- Bathroom facilities - shared $\bullet$ Nutritious meals

Residences: Residences (subject to availability) are great for students who want more independence. Residences offer: Shared bathroom, kitchen, living area, linen and towels, a private or shared room, no meals - provide your own.

We offer two types of residence accommodation:

- Standard Residences: Available only from early May to the third week in August. Located in the city centre within walking distance of the school. Distance: ~15 min. walk.
- Shared Student Accommodation: Available year round, they offer self-catering facilities occupied either in whole or in part by students. Distance: $\sim 50$ minutes by transit.

Private Apartments: Apartments are fully equipped and include a bedroom, kitchen, living area, laundry facilities and, in some cases, maid service.

The program's goals go beyond teaching English to include leadership skills, expanding horizons, making new friends and discovering new cultures.Location and Facilities: Classes take place in the very heart of Toronto, either at our campus or our summer campus at Toronto Metropolitan University. Facilities include large bright modern classrooms equipped with computers and projectors, student lounges, lockers, and wifi.

Classes-English Plus Leadership Skills-20 Lessons per week: The standard program includes 20 lessons ( 50 minutes each) per week, 8:40 am to 12:20 pm daily. Quality accommodation is critical to student satisfaction. Our in-house accommodation service regularly inspects and tracks accommodation quality to ensure comfort and satisfaction. Homestay accommodation is located within 40 to 55 minutes of the school by public transport.
