Entertainment, arts and culture

There are many opportunities to enjoy arts, culture and entertainment in and around Oxford.

Visit <u>Modern Art Oxford</u> to see cutting-edge exhibitions featuring international contemporary artists. The gallery also organises live music events, discussions and film screenings.

The **New Theatre Oxford** hosts some of the biggest shows and well-known names, whilst alternative venues such as <u>The Old Fire</u>. <u>Station</u> and <u>The North Wall</u> host more unusual performances.

Local celebrations — if you are in Oxford on the first of May, join in with the famous <u>May Morning</u> celebrations. In July, celebrate cultural diversity at the colourful <u>Cowley Road Carnival</u>.

Watch a film in one of **Oxford's cinemas**, with options including big multiplexes and small independent picture houses. The boutique <u>Curzon Cinema</u> is one of the city's most popular.



Sports and leisure






